

PRESENTATION TO BARTLESVILLE SCHOOL BOARD

HOW BARTLESVILLE EDUCATION PROMISE HELPS OUR STUDENTS TO SUCCEED.

The mission of Bartlesville Education Promise is committed to helping our schools achieve improved graduation rates and educational outcomes for all students. The following are the key programs that BEP funds in the interest of raising proficiency of all Bartlesville students.

1. Third Grade Reading.
2. Provide after school professional tutoring (by Bartlesville public school teachers).
3. Provide Transition Summer Camps.
4. Make summer months productive for Bartlesville students.

RESULTS OF 2016/17 BEP PROGRAMS:

- THERE HAS BEEN A 55% REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF 3RD GRADERS THAT FAILED TO BE PROMOTED TO THE 4TH GRADE DUE TO NOT PASSING THE STATE MANDATED READINESS TEST OR QUALIFIED FOR AN EXEMPTION.
- Of the 22 “at risk” students that attended the BHS Transition Courses, 21 were promoted to the 10th grade.
- After school tutoring was started at ALL Bartlesville schools.
- 1090 students attended either math or English after school tutoring at Madison or Central.
- 110 students attended after school 3rd grade reading at the elementary schools.
- Watch Dogs (dad’s involvement) was started at Madison and Wilson and was a BIG success.
- 600 students attended after school tutoring at the High School in math, science or English.

- 450 students attended teacher led Art Camp at the Boys & Girls Club and Teen Center
- 270 students attended Transition Camps at Central and Madison. Each received strong student feedback support.
- 186 students attended 1 week of STEM Camp at Tri-County Tech with 66 “high risk” students receiving scholarships. Business support was strong outlining the types of education needed in to succeed in various careers, and 200 students attended Science Camp at the Boys & Girls Club.
- Over 2,800 students participated in at least one aspect of BEP Activities.
- 72 teachers participated in BEP educational efforts and received an hourly compensation with benefits, and over 100 volunteers helped in the schools.
- The Bartlesville Education Promise was named THE MOST OUTSTANDING SCHOOL SUPPORT PROGRAM IN OKLAHOMA, by the Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence. (October 17, 2017).
